Colorado WINS was born in 2007 when state employees decided to pool their resources and come together for a greater voice.

### Who We Are

We work to improve quality of services, safety, pay and benefits, working conditions, conflict resolution, staff attrition and more to ensure an effective workforce to serve all Coloradans. We are snow plow drivers, nurses, and corrections officers. We are working people - black, white, and brown - from the Western Slope to the Eastern Plains, who join together in action to have a say in what happens on the job and in our communities.



We know that the opportunity to join a union — no matter where you work — is the best way to raise wages, improve working conditions, create family-sustaining jobs and begin to fix the rigged economy.



What is a union? The meaning is right there in the name: Unity. A union is a group of workers who band together to bargain for what is fair and right for their families and their communities. Together, we raise standards and fight to make sure no worker is left behind. There's another way to spell union, it's P-O-W-E-R.

Now that we have secured victories at the state house, we educate our membership on any new legislation. We also work with management to ensure that new policies will be rolled out smoothly at departmental levels.

### **July - August**

During the summer we have programs with our coworkers to prepare for election season and set our goals and objectives for the next electoral cycle.

### Sept. - Dec.

We know that we need elected officials who put working people first in their policies, not corporations or special interest groups. During Election Season we work hard to elect people who will fight for state employees and their families. From endorsements to door knocking, we are hands on during the elections!

During the year, we also hold smaller membership meetings at worksites and other opportunities to connect with your union family.

### Political Engagement

As a strong union, we have to elect pro-union candidates. We need to vet and endorse candiddates, then hold them accountable once they are elected. Lobby Days and town halls help us engage legislators so they will support and enforce our negotiated working conditions and benefits.



### Membership Growth

To be a strong union we have to constantly work to build our power and our numbers. This committee will grow our membership by talking to members and recruiting potential members. It's important that as we build power we move our coworkers to action and demonstrate our union power, especially around the new contract.

### Member Strength

We also want all members to feel welcome in our union. When everyone feels like the union is representative of them, they will feel comfortable stepping up and exercising their power. Engaging with new and potential members means presenting at NEOs and engaging new members. All need to feel welcome included and informed about our contract actions.

### **How It Works**

It all starts with membership. Members direct everything that happens in our union. We are at the heart of every decision Colorado WINS makes, because we make the decisions.



Members are the biggest and most important part of how our union works. We elect our leaders and compose our committees.

Member Engagement Committee

The Member Engagement Committee welcomes new hires and members and helps everyone find their role in our union.

Membership Growth Committee

The Member Growth Committe builds our power through outreach to their coworkers to recruit new members.

Political Engagement Committee

The Political Engagement Committee ensures that we elect leaders into office who will support pro-union legislation and worker friendly programs.

Executive Board

The Executive Board are union members who are elected by union members to create and drive the overall strategy for our union.

### **Union Dues: An Investment in Power**

1.5%

Dues are 1.5 percent of salary. By choosing to be a union member, you are making a small investment in a greater cause.



With a contract, state employees will see an even bigger return on their investment through guaranteed wage increases and better benefits.




Equal pay and an end to merit-based raises will make employees of all demographics and seniority feel valued.

### COPE is our voice, our vote and our power.

COPE stands for "Committee on Political Education" and it is the political arm of Colorado WINS. It allows us to mobilize members to be a powerful force in the political process.

Voluntary contributions to COPE also provide financial support to politicians who support state employees. Each contribution helps build our power and level the playing field. Together we can hold our political leaders accountable to ensure we have respect on the job, good wages and benefits, and are put in a position to do the best job we can.



### **BUILDING POWER**

Teachers, construction workers, and professionals across industries come together to form unions to have collective power and create positive changes for their jobs, communities, and families. That's what we're doing at Colorado WINS. But corporate interests contribute enormous sums of money to influence legislation and regulations. They want to keep wages low and block our efforts to win victories for working people by spending their money misleading workers about what a union is and what we are doing. Individually, each of us is no match for their power.



That's why we must use our membership strength and ability to pool our money to fight for issues that make our communities better. If we don't, we can't hold lawmakers accountable for protecting our rights and the rights of the Coloradans we serve. We collect voluntary donations to our Committee on Political Education (COPE) to expand and preserve workers' rights on the job, protect our patients, and preserve appropriate funding for the services our hospitals provide.
